5	24	County Judge	To approve an increase in the hauling effort from current \$5M, increase by \$23M for a total of \$28M and an increase in the monitoring effort current \$3M, increase by \$4M for a total of \$7M. ***** To allow Harris County Housing & Community Development to prepare with CAO and execute data sharing agreements with FEMA, SBA, HUD, and approved third party contractors to expeditiously and effectively substantiate Harris County's need for federal aid, and especially support of its low to moderate income residents. This data may include individuals and households registrant and assistance data in areas identified by HUD or the County as most impacted and distressed as a result of the major disasters. Data will only be available to authorized users of Harris County and approved third party contractors in secure and encrypted means. ***** To authorize the County Judge to execute a new mutual aid agreement with the City of Houston to provide or receive emergency assistance, police protection services, public health and welfare services, and other governmental functions as authorized by the County Judge or other designated Harris County officials, in accordance with Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code and FEMA reimbursement guidelines.
